## IF YOU ARE PLANNING FOR COLLEGE:

It is recommended that college bound students take two years of a foreign language. However, in the state of Utah, the University of Utah is the only school that requires two years of a foreign language for admittance, and BYU highly recommends it. If you are planning on going out of state for college, you will want to check that particular institution's website for a foreign language requirement. Furthermore, if you are planning on the Regents Scholarship, you will need two consecutive years of the same foreign language in grades 9-12.

Many colleges also suggest 4.0 credits of Mathematics, 3-4 credits of Science, and 3-4 credits of Social Studies
