# Citizenship



Your Citizenship (Behavior) Grade represents how often you are demonstrating positive and productive behavior (Habits of Success) in the classroom and at school.

# Habits of Success - Student Expectations

- ★ Be on time to class
- ★ Maintain regular attendance (OR work from home, communicate with teacher)
- ★ Be prepared with a charged Chromebook
- ★ Be prepared with class materials
- ★ Be attentive (on task)
- ★ Turn assignments in on time
- ★ Sit in assigned seat
- ★ Respect substitute teacher
- ★ Contribute to a positive learning environment
- ★ Be responsible with electronic devices
- ★ Use class breaks appropriately--limit hall pass use
- ★ Be honest with class work--academic integrity (cheating/plagiarism)
- ★ Use school appropriate language and conduct
- ★ Be respectful of school property (classroom equipment, Chromebooks,...)



- Random “citizenship” drawing for prize/treat

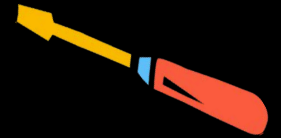
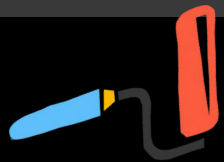
## School Rewards
